A RADICAL "YES" TO GOD

"God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise, and God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong...so that no human being might boast before God." (1 Corinthians 1:27, 29)

A short trip was taken to a Trappist Monastery----short because it wasn't our final destination, and we had two small boys with us. Two small boys generally means a short time at a monastery.

As we approached, the two-year old spoke: "There's the monascary!" Well, we thought, no doubt some people would perceive the place in just those terms!



The truth is, what monasteries, and religious life in general, represent to us is a radical "yes" to God. And that can be a little frightening.

It is also a little frightening to read the words of Paul and see how utterly opposed the truth he preaches is to the ways of this world, and how, once we embrace that and say "yes" to living it, it will change our world.

"Yes" is scary. But in its own, powerful way, so is "no."

Lord Jesus, give me the courage to say "yes".

LET'S TALK LITURGY by Margaret O'Malley

The last several weeks have been rich with the celebration of memorials of Saints. St. Agnes, January 21; St. Francis deSales, January 24; Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle, January 25; Sts. Timothy and Titus, January 26; St. Thomas Aquinas, January 28; St. John Bosco, January 31. January 23 was the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children and February 2 is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (which used to mark the end of the Christmas Season!)

January 23 was also the memorial of a newly canonized Saint - Marianne Cope. Marianne Cope was canonized in October of 2012. Marianne was a member of the Sisters of Saint Francis in Syracuse, New York. She was instrumental in establishing two of the first hospitals in the central New York area – these hospitals were open to all people regardless of ethnicity, religion or race. She also served people afflicted with leprosy in Hawaii. She helped established homes for leprosy patients and cared for St. Damien DeVeuster of Molokai who contracted leprosy after years of ministry in the community. Following his death Marianne continued his work. She lived the Franciscan call to serve the 'crucified', the most vulnerable in society.

Normally a saint's feast is the day of their death which in Marianne's case would be August 9, however that is the memorial of St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) so the American Bishops instead suggested January 23 which is the date of Marianne's birth.

These feast days wind throughout our entire liturgical year. All of them lived some aspect of Christ's Paschal Mystery in a unique and powerful way. They are the heroes of our faith upon whose shoulders we stand. Each has a story that can teach us something about living our faith today.
