GOD SEES ALL

"Even should she forget, I will never forget you." (Isaiah 49:15)

Many of us were privileged with the opportunity of being educated by holy religious sisters, and remember their teachings well. We can still hear our grade-school teachers saying, "Remember boys and girls, God sees everything." At the time, we saw this expression as a motivation to avoid behaving badly, but now we see it as an encouragement for doing good.



Our teachers were right in saying that God sees everything we do, but this "everything" includes a concern not only for faults, but also for virtues.

Isaiah compares this concern to the watchful care of a mother for her child, but says that even if she does forget her child, the Lord will never forget us.

Let us rejoice in the fact that God's watchful concern for us is complete: not just the bad, but also the good.

LET'S TALK LITURGY by Margaret O'Malley

As I write this article Ash Wednesday is just a week away.

Forty days of penance and fasting. A time to give something up that I really like. No meat on Fridays.

But maybe I have the wrong focus – maybe it is a time to change a habit that I know needs to be changed. Maybe it is a time to spend a few minutes a day in prayer and reflection. Maybe this year I should think about doing something extra rather than giving something up.

Then there are those great soup suppers -a time to share a meal with friends - maybe make some new friends - and to learn and reflect on my faith during the presentations this year.

I could take one of those little black books that are available each year. I have heard that it only takes about five or six minutes a day to use them. I could probably take one of those Rice Bowls too - I could put my change in there at the end of the day - it would make my purse lighter!

Maybe instead of (or in addition to) giving up my favorite candy, TV show or computer game I could also do something positive. Maybe I could help my neighbor – I notice she has been struggling since she had that new baby. And there is the older man down the street who lost his wife – maybe he could use a visit. Maybe I could volunteer at the – well Lent is only six weeks long maybe I will have to pick one or two things and try them this year!

Oh – sorry – I didn't realize I was still typing!

It is worth considering though – what is our attitude toward Lent? Is it just the weeks that lead up to spring break – is it a time to look for a new outfit for Easter – or is it a time to recalibrate our spiritual life?

Hopefully, we can all spend at least some time this lent focusing on the spiritual life. Try to attend at least some of the soup suppers – there are only four this year. Attend the Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings. Use the little black books and the rice bowl and its calendar suggestions at home. Make this lent six weeks of doing instead of not doing!


