MAKING A DIFFERENCE

"It is so that the works of God might be made visible through Him." (John 9:3)



Jesus performed a great work in healing the man born blind. What a difference he must have made in that man's life. We may feel our work has little or no impact on others. When we are tempted to think that way, recall perhaps that you are a teacher and it is the last day of your first semester teaching high school. Your students had been less than enthusiastic to learn freshman theology. By the time of the final exam, you began to doubt that your teaching made any difference. Then, on the way out of class, the quietest student hands you a letter from your class in which they listed all the ways their faith had grown throughout the semester. You are stunned! How could you have been so blind?

From that moment on, we should understand that our work does make a difference when you realize it's ultimately God's work being done. Jesus acknowledges this as well. Before curing the blind man, our Lord pointed out that he was doing the work of God.

Lord, help me to see that the difference I make is in the work that you send me to do.

LET'S TALK LITURGY by Margaret O'Malley

Yesterday, March 25 was the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. The Gospel of the day recounts the story of the angel coming to Mary and announcing that she has been chosen to be the mother of God. She is a young woman who is asked to do the impossible. She is already engaged to Joseph. Being found pregnant in her culture would have meant death. She risks hurting Joseph and bringing shame to his family.

Despite all of this she risks execution because she is sure that she is being called to be the Mother of God. Her faith is stronger than her fear. She doesn't know what the road ahead holds for her but she is willing to follow it. She trusts totally in God and consents to bringing Christ's presence into the world.

I often reflect on what kind of faith and strength saying yes must have taken! So often Mary is picture as a submissive, delicate young girl. She was also a strong and courageous woman. Revealing to Joseph that she was pregnant, knowing that it could result in her death, must have been very difficult. (Those conversations are difficult today in our culture).

I think about things that we are asked to do that take much less faith and strength and we have difficulty saying yes. Mary is a wonderful role model! If we can develop just a small percentage of the trust she had in God we will have accomplished a lot! I pray that our faith will be stronger than our fear!


