

'TAKE YOUR SON ISAAC...'

Today's first reading is one of the most important religious texts ever written. While it is strange for us to read of a god asking for human sacrifice, that was nothing out of the ordinary in Abraham's world. It is because of the story of Abraham and Isaac that human and child sacrifice looks the way it does to us.



Human sacrifice is not some aberration in human history. In one way or another, it is the norm. The other gods humans have worshipped, whether they go by ancient names like Baal and Moloch, or modern names like Choice and National Security, have always demanded what is most precious, our sons and daughters. It is only the God of Abraham who does not demand but provides the sacrifice.

The story of Abraham and Isaac begins the trajectory that ends with Christ. When Paul tells the Romans that God "did not spare his own Son," he is linking Jesus and Isaac and pointing us toward the inversion of sacrifice. This inversion transfigures human history. What could this rising from the dead mean? That the one who gave himself to be sacrificed so that we might see the truth about human sacrifice was God's own Son.

SPECIAL EMERGENCY COLLECTION FIJI HIT BY 3 BACK-TO-BACK CYCLONES

God is our refuge and strength, an everpresent help in trouble. Therefore, we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters rage and foam. Psalm 46:1-4

Bishop Boyea has received a request for a special collection from two priests currently serving the Diocese of Lansing. Fr. Kusi Cobona, The Catholic Community of Saints James, Cornelius and Cyprian, and Fr. Leronio Vodivodi, Holy Family, Grand Blanc, who hail from Fiji, have requested this special collection on behalf of their devastated families and for the tens of thousands of Fijians who have encountered **3 back-to-back cyclones** recently. *"The damages are like the flooding and destruction of Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans. Many homes were blown away by the first cyclone, crops were damaged. The next two brought in so much rain that caused so many floods in places that had never been flooded before."*

Specifically, they are looking for donations to help the parish of St. Martin de Porres, Lakeba Island, Fiji. *"Our Parish is still recovering as we have completely lost our Parish hall, with damaged to the Church, Presbytery, dining hall and the old Sr's convent, resiliently we are managing with limited resources financially and physically as we are able to improvise with what we have at hand. I hope and pray you will be able to respond with love to the cries of our people in Fiji."* Peni Vula Vanua

THE GOSPEL OF LIFE @ 25: PART 5 POPE ST. JOHN PAUL & OUR REVERSION TO "A STATE OF BARBARISM"

Just over a quarter of a century ago, Pope Saint John Paul II released his encyclical, *Evangelium Vitae*, in response to the ever-increasing attacks against human life and dignity. Each Friday, we aim to explore a different aspect the prophetic papal document.

Today's passage drawn from Section 15 of the encyclical where Pope John Paul warns against a reversion to "a state of barbarism" that would see newborn babies, who are unwanted by their parents, left to die or actively killed with the connivance of the medical authorities:

"The point has been reached where the most basic care, even nourishment, is denied to babies born with serious handicaps or illnesses. The contemporary scene, moreover, is becoming even more alarming by reason of the proposals, advanced here and there, to justify even infanticide, following the same arguments used to justify the right to abortion. In this way, we revert to a state of barbarism which one hoped had been left behind forever." Pope Saint John Paul II, Section 15, *Evangelium Vitae*.

Reflecting upon this passage today is Jenny Ingles, Director of Fertility and Life Ministries for the Diocese of Lansing. Jenny writes:

"In his encyclical, *Evangelium Vitae*, John Paul II recognizes that "proposals" have been made to justify infanticide using the same arguments used to justify abortion."

"This hit US news hard in 2019 when New York's Governor Andrew Cuomo signed into law the New York "Reproductive Health Act" on the anniversary of Roe v Wade. This law permits abortions to occur at any time in pregnancy (even moments before the baby is to be delivered) for the health of the mother. This guised legislation ignores the fact that the most effective means to save a mother's life in these situations is the delivery (vaginal or C-section) of a baby, not its dismemberment."

"A backlash was felt throughout the country where many people, rightfully, saw that the next step in the abortion industry was infanticide. Bills were proposed in many areas that would protect children who were born alive after 'failed' abortions. Despite insistence from the abortion industry that babies born alive after 'failed' abortions are never left to die unless they're under 22-weeks gestation, reports of these atrocities do exist. And as many states attempt follow New York's lead in permitting late-term abortions, there will be an inevitable increase of babies born alive after these botched abortions."

"It is important for us to do everything we can to fight for an unborn (and born) child's right to life. May we be guided by the Holy Spirit in our efforts and may Mother Mary protect these little ones."


